Based on the success of our weekly Social Club and our end of year virtual events we will be increasing our virtual lessons throughout 2023.

School Improvements

The school hall is approaching completion. It looks fabulous, and we are looking at a finishing date towards the end of March.

The communication hub is well underway. This project is to support our distance education team deliver real time live lessons to increase online interaction between students, tutors and teaching staff. Additionally, we have had two sound-proof Busy Pods installed to provide additional space for teaching and learning via distance. These projects will be great initiatives to support teaching and learning in distance education.

Our Cab-ra-nanga playground has been resurfaced with new Softfall and is due for completion this week. We are now going to start the development of a new playground space in the Yenni-beau area. The Red Class are mapping out the area and studying the plans in class.



In Blue Class students explored various ways of applying paint with a variety of different materials. The results were a spectacular array of colour, texture and patterns. With Yellow Class, I have participated in inclusive weaving activities involving adjustments to the classroom environment to allow all students to use a loom and weft technique.

I am thoroughly enjoying the Distance Education Social Club on Tuesdays. I have been able to meet many students and families. It was great to hear about the activities that people did in the holidays. Also, it was lovely to meet some siblings who were off to university. The staff have been working in Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) Groups to plan 2023 school activities. The focus areas are (1) Student Growth and Attainment (2) Student Wellbeing, and (3) Successful Transitions and Personalised Pathways.

This year, Sir Eric Woodward School is involved in the Department of Education External Validation process. This provides an opportunity for the school to discuss their judgements about their practice – and the evidence that underpins them – with a panel of peers. The school panel will meet in September to evaluate the Sir Eric Woodward submission. I will keep you updated on our progress.







I look forward to seeing what you all achieve in 2023!




